A Reflection on Father's Day

...I am a modest participant in a much greater world of love.

Becoming a father may be the most uplifting and ennobling experience a man will ever have. Suddenly, one's focus is not on self but on another. That "other" is a person, one whom I love immediately and deeply, who enters my world fully dependent on others.

The first moment holding my newborn daughter I knew "I" was no longer the center of the universe. I realized that the gift of my existence was much more generous than I had understood, including recognition of what my father and mother gave to me.

Fatherhood opened me both to a deeper understanding of other persons, and also to a more intense appreciation of God and his plan of life for us.

As my children grew, *they learned from their mother and me every day as they progressed--first smiles, then steps, words, soon relationships. Each brought me joy, and also wisdom and reverence for their lives. In time they shared ideas that brought me important new insights. My joy continues today as they progress in their adult lives.*

As parents we also value those who touch their lives as *in loco parentis*--the teachers, coaches, priests, religious sisters and brothers, relatives and friends who have helped them grow in God's love and their faith.

Ultimately, I understand that I am a modest participant in a much greater world of love. Each child is unique, remarkable. I am grateful and humbled that I have been a vital part of our children becoming unique children of God, and I recognize that God's love is the foundation of all the joy I find in my children.

I have a friend who loves giving gifts. They’re mostly small things, like a book or a candy bar, but they let us know he’s thinking of us and cares for us. It’s usually not so much the gift itself that strikes me as it is the love I know is behind the giving. A much greater gift of love is the Eucharist: the Father’s sacrifice in giving his Son and Christ’s gift of his own self are so striking because they come from the deepest kind of love there is. If I allow it, this kind of love changes me, and inspires me to reflect it outward to others. It helps me continue to grow in God’s image - a growth that could might even be shown through the simple loving gift of a candy bar.

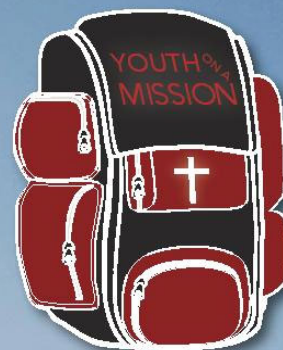
Liturgy of the Hours: Of the Solemnity
